The objective of the visit was to make sure policy makers are aware of various natural resource related works that are being done on the ground. The idea of the visit is to support them in making informed decisions. The parliamentary members who visited the BERSMP programme site were from three standing committees that are relevant to the natural resource management work the programme is carrying out in the Bale Mountains Eco-region. The group has previously visited the Chilimo forest participatory forest management site of FARM-Africa and SOS Sahel Ethiopia.
